



Tips for Mosquito Control

Check your yard and decks for any container that can hold water.
Mosquitos lay eggs every three days in anything that can contain water
and these eggs hatch within a few days.
A bottle cap full of water will allow more than 25 mosquitos to hatch in less than a week!

Please be especially attentive to:

Buckets	Tree holes and root holes
Cans	Pet water bowls
Bottle	Bottle Tops
Bottle Tops	Trash cans without lids
Toys, particularly plastic	Trash can lids left upside down
Jars and their lids	Flat roofs
Swimming or wading pools	Boats & canoes
Tires	Unused hot tubs
Wheelbarrows	Rain barrels
Wagons	Tarps over wood piles or equipment
Bird baths	Air conditioner drain areas
Cups	Ceramic bowls/old toilet bowels &tubs
Flower pots & saucers	Plastic drain pipe
Blocked gutters	Kiddie Pools not in use
Drinking cups	Patio furniture
Ashtrays	Discarded plastic packaging

Rain gutters can breed large numbers of mosquitoes if not cleaned so that they flow.

Please use the "TIP OR TOSS" method to dispose of standing water and/or containers themselves.

Adult mosquitos can fly 100 yards, so problems may come from containers in someone else's yard.
We must work as a community to make our neighborhood as Mosquito Hostile environment.

Containers that previously held water should be washed to eliminate mosquito eggs
